As I think about March, the Graham Kendrick song, "We Are Marching in the Light of God" keeps playing in my mind. It's an upbeat, motivating melody that encourages us to march, live, love and dance in the light and love of Christ Jesus. That's a good song to lead us into this month! Perhaps we'll sing it one Sunday. This month of March is also completely dedicated to LENT, offering us an opportunity to consider somethings.

May I encourage each of us to consider (and read the passage listed):

- Making time for PRAYER first thing in the morning (*Ephesians 6:10-20*) or last thing at night (*Psalm 4:7-8*)
- Asking yourself, in these turbulent times, where does your help come from? (*Psalm 121*)
- **R**esting and **R**efreshing yourself. We all need rest. Whether it's deep breathing, yoga, or 5 minutes in the sun, take time to be refreshed. (*Psalm 23*)
- Connecting with a ministry of our church where you might just discover a gift God has given you. Teach a Sunday school class or help with Play Group, or sign up to make coffee. (*Romans 12*)
- Helping another person with transportation, a meal, a phone call, or an invitation to church. There are 59 "one another" scriptures. Want the whole list? Ask me! (*1 Peter 4:10*)

ADDITIONAL SUNDAY SCHOOL INFORMATION

Sunday School is for all children ages prek3-6th grade. There are two classes: prek3-3rd and 4th-6th. Children accompany their parents to worship in the church at 10:00 a.m. After the Children's Message, the Sunday school teachers walk all the children over to the Parish Hall to begin their lessons. At 11:00 a.m., after worship service concludes, parents pick up their child(ren) from their classroom.

• *Sunday School <u>does not</u> meet on the last Sunday of each month or holiday weekends. CE Calendar is available, call the church office. Sunday school runs through May 17.

During worship there is a **Nursery Room** available in the back of the Sanctuary, for infants through kindergarten ages. This room has a monitor so parents can watch the service and take care of their children whom are unable to sit through the worship service.
